

Our Destiny is Elsewhere

- Matthew 5.3,10–12
 - → How will I respond to hardship and persecution this year?
 - ▶ People mocking me for righteousness
 - ▶ People excluding me because of my beliefs/standards/morals
 - ▶ If I was on trial for being a Christian, would there be enough evidence to convict?
 - Our persecution reveals our destiny.
 - → Our reward is coming.



Conduct Reflects Destiny

- Matthew 5.9-10 in the kingdom? Sons of God!
 - → My behavior indicates the kind of person I am and the destiny of my life.
 - Am I humble (5.3)? Am I pure in heart (5.8)?
 - Am I merciful (5.7)? Am I a peacemaker (5.9)?
 - Conforming my behavior to God's will is crucial:
 - It's how I preserve the world (5.13)
 - It's how I give light to the world (5.14f)
 - It's how I lead people to God (5.16)



Conduct Begins in the Heart

- Matthew 5.20 we must be better than the scribes and Pharisees
 - → Murder is wrong but so is the attitude which leads to it (5.21f).
 - ▶ Am I in control of my emotions?
 - ▶ Note the test that Jesus recommends how good am I at controlling my tongue?
 - → Adultery is wrong but so is the attitude which produces it (5.27ff).
 - Ungodly lust is condemned in all its forms
 - Such an attitude is heartfelt and wrong
 - I "keep my heart with all diligence" by avoiding such sins by any means necessary.
