





- Our first introduction to Jesus in the New Testament.
 - "Son of..." expresses lineage Matthew 1.1
 - Hebrews lacked a specific term for grandparents.
- Why identify Jesus as a descendant of David?
 - Because of God's promise to David Psalm 132.11
 - ➡ The Jews understood the concept of this prophecy Mt. 22.42
 - ➡ The "Son of David" was term to reference the coming Messiah.
 - This explains the Jewish aristocracy's furor in Matthew 21.15
 - This was fulfilled in Jesus Christ Acts 2.30-32



- What is the significance of Abraham?
 - God made three notable promises to him Genesis 12.1-3
 - Land (Joshua 21.43); Nation (1 Kings 4.20); Seed
- Why identify Jesus as a descendant of Abraham?
 - He is the promised "Seed" of Abraham Acts 3.25-26
 - Which makes the Jewish rejection of Him more sad John 8.37-40
 - Paul emphasized this same reality Galatians 3.16
 - ➡ The Seed of Abraham who benefits all nations Gal. 3.7-9,14



- One of the most popular designations of Jesus in the New Testament (84x – popular in Matthew and Luke).
 - It is an emphasis of His humanity Mt. 8.20; 17.22
 - Especially when coupled with His divinity Mt. 9.6
- Why should we note Jesus as the Son of Man?
 - There is a connection with OT prophecy Daniel 7.13f
 - It reminds us of the reality of the Savior's love Mark 14.41
 - It reminds us that we can relate to Jesus Hebrews 3.1,6
 - It reminds us that He can relate to us Hebrews 4.14-16



- An unmistakable reference to the divinity (deity, Godhood) of Jesus.
 - John 5.16-18
- The phrase does not describe Jesus as the literal progeny of God, but describes a relationship.
 - God is a spirit being, not a human John 4.24 (Luke 24.39)
 - The phrase remarks on their relationship:
 - ➡ A relationship marked by love Matthew 27.43; John 10.17
 - ➡ A relationship marked by submission John 6.38; 15.10
